- •Seeding weak areas in the fairways, collars, greens, and tees
- •Spraying weeds in both rough and fairways
- •Seeding the Par 3 tees
- •Moving the plug piles to areas along the cart paths where needed
- •Enlarging some of the small ladies tees
- •Fixing any irrigation leaks we have on the course

By outsourcing the aerification, we will have some 30 days to work on these items before the leaves really start to fall.

PACE OF PLAY & ETIQUETTE REMINDERS

Pace of Play:

Our expected pace of play here at Twin Lakes is 3 hours and 45 minutes to 4 hours for an 18-hole round of golf. We are aware that some groups are used to and are able to play in less time, but that cannot be the expectation, especially when we are busy. **There should be no non-tournament rounds taking over 4 hours.** For tournaments, we have been putting expected pace of play on scorecards to help groups keep track and remain accountable during tournament play.

Golf Cart Etiquette:

When taking a golf cart, we need to make sure of a few things. There should be no golf carts on and around tee boxes. When teeing off, please keep your cart on the cart path until you have driven past all tee boxes. Additionally, carts should return to the cart path when within 20 yards of any edge of any green. There should never be a question as to whether or not a cart is on a green and keeping them on the cart path helps us avoid those pesky bare spots. Finally, all Twin Lakes golf carts should remain on golf course property. Please do not take your cart in neighboring yards or on roads adjacent to the golf course.

Golf Course Etiquette:

Here at Twin Lakes, we pride ourselves on being an open and welcoming community to golfers of any age or background. We are also proud to see many families and junior golfers playing. In order to keep this welcoming environment, please refrain from shouting inappropriate language on the golf course. Believe me, I know golf can be frustrating, but please keep the volume down for the sake of other golfers and residents of the neighborhood around the golf course.

Caring for the Course:

Golf Course Superintendent Mike Seaton and his staff continue to do a wonderful job at keeping our course beautiful. Please do your part as a golfer to help out. Please fix ball marks on the greens and replace or fill divots with sand. This little bit goes a long way and ensures Twin Lakes' course conditions stay wonderful!

Dress Code:

The Dress Code is in effect until October. When on the golf course or using the practice facilities, please make sure your attire fits the dress code. Appropriate clothing is golf clothing similar to the apparel sold in the Golf Shop. T-shirts, tank tops, halter tops, gym shorts, cargo shorts, and jeans are not considered appropriate clothing.
